Homework Policy

Homework Policy

Homework will mostly be set using the Takeaway Homework menu, which enables students to have a choice about which tasks they would like to complete. By engaging in Takeaway Homework, students will develop organisational and time management skills, as well as resilience and independence. Students will be set a clear amount of tasks and a deadline for completion, this information will be available on Show My Homework.

The aims of the tasks on the menus will be to use prior knowledge from lessons, to encourage independent work away from the classroom and evaluative tasks to consolidate learning. Menus can feature in a variety of ways with the general ideas of a selection from simpler to more challenging tasks. Some will feature a grid showing 'mild' to 'extra hot' tasks, others may include a starter, main and dessert option, whilst others may include a variety of different tasks all worth an amount of 'points' (the higher the points the harder the task) with students selecting tasks which add up to an amount set by the teacher. For written based subjects *at least* one task will be a piece of extended writing. For students in Key Stage 4 the choice of tasks will include questions and tasks linked specifically to their exams so this will form part of their revision for their examination subjects.

All menus will have the option of choice, be meaningful and provide challenge for students.

Homework Expectations:

There will be no formal homework timetable published; this is to allow staff the flexibility to set appropriate homework at a time, which will enable continuous learning.

It is important that student have opportunities to develop their interests outside of school, as well as to have homework to extend their learning. Therefore, there is a maximum amount of time to be spent on homework each day:

* *Students should ensure homework time is planned to allow deadlines to be met*

Year 7 and 8 Homework

- Homework will be set using a menu of tasks *at least* once per half term.
- Occasionally subjects may need to set homework independently from this.
- Students should record homework in their planner and use this to manage their workload.

Year 9, 10 and 11 Homework

- Homework will be set using a menu of tasks *at least* once per half term.
- The menus will feature a range of exam questions and/or revision based activities.
- Occasionally subjects may need to set homework independently from this.
- Students should record homework in their planner and use this to manage their workload.

Year 12 and 13 Homework

- Students will be set work to a timetable agreed between themselves and their subject teachers.
- Students should study their chosen subjects for as much time outside the classroom as they are taught inside it. This should mean four hours of study. Staff will direct part of this study time as 'homework' by setting assignments, coursework etc.
- The study centre is to be used during the day to complete assigned work and homework tasks.

Responsibilities:

Students:

- Check Show My Homework daily, or use the school homework planner if there are issues accessing the internet
- Try their very best when completing all homework and hand it in by the deadline
- Make use of the homework club in the library ICT suite after school, which runs Monday to Thursday 2.50pm – 4.05pm, as necessary
- Speak to the class teacher well in advance of the lesson if there are any issues regarding the homework
- Catch up on missed work or to repeat homework deemed unsatisfactory by the class teacher

Teachers:

- Set appropriate, high-quality homework to allow all students to consolidate learning and extend their knowledge with the overall aim of making progress
- Ensure homework is available on Show my Homework
- Feedback is given as per the marking and feedback policy
- Provide support/help to all students as required

Parents:

- Encourage students to complete homework
- Where possible use Show My Homework to monitor their child's progress regarding homework
- Support the school when sanctions are given if students do not meet the required expectations
